TONOPAH MINER DIES SUDDENLY

TONOPAH, Nev., Aug. 5. (Special)-Joseph J. Sealey, fifty-year-old leaser at the Tonopah divide, died suddenly this morning. The nature of his illness was undetermined and physicians planned an autopsy later today.

Mr. Sealey entered a clinic yesterday morning in a delirious condition, and failed to show improvement. Physicians at the clinic said his temperature reached 107 degrees.

He was owner of a ranch east of Sparks operated by his wife and two stepsons. They were visiting him here when he became ill. A native of Virginia, he had resided in Tonopah for the last ten years.
